Three days a week the ones who are having difficulty receive tutoring in Mathematics, French and Chemistry. Everyone is trying hard and we continue to pray all will be successful.

Myrese is in her final year of High School and is spending a lot of time preparing for the state exams coming up at the end of the school year.

In the afternoons and evenings, you will often see the young adults doing homework, writing notes on the blackboard, working out math/chemistry problems, working on the computers or studying their lessons.
